The Kitasoo Xai'xais Nation is an Indigenous government that holds aboriginal rights and asserts aboriginal title to its entire territory.

- You are welcome to visit the many Conservancies and Marine Parks throughout the Territory.
- Indian Reserves, marked as IR on navigation charts, are private property - access is not permitted.
- To protect wildlife and their habitats visiting Ecological Reserves is not permitted.
- We ask that you conduct yourself with respect for the land, water, and all living beings.

The Kitasoo Xai'xais Nation actively protects and stewards the lands, oceans, and resources in the territory. Guardian Watchmen and Kitasoo Xai'xais Stewardship Authority staff are out in the territory daily undertaking research, monitoring and compliance activities.

Wilderness Camping

Wilderness camping is allowed year-round at the recommended camp sites throughout the territory (see map). No facilities are provided and there is no fee. Visitors need to be self-sufficient and prepared. Non-potable water is available at some locations. Food and attractants must be stowed so that it is not accessible to wildlife. There is a grocery store in Klemtu.

Leave No Trace

The Kitsoo Xai'xais Nation welcomes thousands of visitors to the territory every year. We ask that you practice "Leave No Trace" camping ethics, including packing out everything that you pack in.

Beachcombing

Collect only garbage from beaches and do not disturb the beach or ground unnecessarily. If you come across an artifact, leave it in place, record the location, and report it to the Kitsoo Xai'xais Stewardship Authority.
